

Private Health Insurance Standards in Ontario

Governed by the Ontario Insurance Ombudsman and the Financial Service Regulatory Authority (FSRA)

- Set regulations to ensure insurance claims are assessed fairly, nonbiased and in the best interest of the public
- Ensures the public has a choice as to which regulated health care provider, they wish to receive care from.
- Ensure that insurers are not anti-competitive, allow for innovation to service the needs of the public




